### **Organizational Setting and Reporting Relationships:**

This position is located in Aviation Section. The incumbent reports to the Chief of the Unit.

### **Responsibilities:**

## Ramp Assistant Accountability

The Ramp Assistant under the daily operational supervision and guidance of the Chief MAOC/CAVO shall have the following responsibilities:

- Ensures that aircraft and vehicle on the UN ramp and in vicinity of the hangar are conducted in accordance with appropriate ICAO, CAA, local and United Nations rules, regulations, policies and guidance.
- Ensures that UN mechanical handling equipment (MHE) is in working condition and properly maintained.
- Ensures that any towing of UN aircraft is conduct in accordance with established procedures
- Ensures that adequate training is conduct for local subordinate staff.
- Monitors and verifies fuel up load for all UN aircraft. Records the amount of fuel registered on the fuel
  tucks gauge and compares it with the amount of fuel indicated on the aircraft's fuel gauge. Ensure that
  refueling operations are conducted in a safe manner.

- Verifies cargo manifest and supervises up/down loading and handing of all cargo. Handles, loads and processes dangerous cargo per ICAO, CAA, IATA, Local and United Nations established regulations, policies and established procedures.
- Reviews aircraft weight and balance records and load manifest. Reports any irregularities to the Chiefs Air operations Officer.
- Ensures the Ground Power Unit (GPU) is operational and available, as required.
- Supervises all personnel on the ramp to ensure that flight line procedures are followed and aircraft vehicles follow ramp movement plans.
- Monitors ramp access per local directives and guidance contained in the UN Air Operations Manual.
- Monitors passenger embarking and disembarking in coordination with MOVCON personnel and local airport authorities.
- Plans aircraft parking locations in accordance with local airport authorities, MOVCON and loading / unloading team.
- Ensures and follows proper aircraft marshalling techniques established in the UN Air Operations Manual.
- Ensures that aircraft are properly parked with breaks and chocks applied.
- Ensures that jet blast and helicopter rotor down wash is considered in marshalling aircraft for parking and taxiing and the ramp is clear of items that could cause Foreign Object Damage (FOD).
- Ensures and maintains control of Vehicle Access and Flight Line Safety as per local directives and guidelines contained in the UN Air Operations Manual.
- Possesses knowledge and understanding of the established Pre Accident Plan.
- Possesses knowledge and understanding of the local Aircraft Evacuation Plan.
- Maintains proper radio terminology and the use of the applicable radios in the ramp and maneuvering area.
- Conducts periodic security inspections of United Nations aircraft for contraband and illegal items.
- Ensures that medical and insect infestation inspections and control is coordinated, as required.
- Acts as liaison between the aircrew, MOVCON and Chief Aviation Officer / Chief MAOC and or Air Terminal Officer.
- Acts as Flight Monitor, as required by the Chief, Aviation Officer.
- Any other duties as assigned by the Chief MAOC and CAVO.

### **Competencies**

- Professionalism: Shows pride in work and achievements; demonstrates professional competence and
  mastery of subject matter; is conscientious and efficient in meeting commitments, observing deadlines
  and achieving results; is motivated by professional rather than personal concerns; shows persistence
  when faced with difficult problems or challenges; remains calm in stressful situations. Takes
  responsibility for incorporating gender perspectives and ensuring the equal participation of women and
  men in all areas of work.
