Organizational Setting and Reporting Relationships:

This position is located in the Field Technology Unit. The incumbent reports to a Supervisor and to the Chief of the Unit.

Responsibilities:

Under the supervision and guidance of a Supervisor and Chief of the Unit, the incumbent will be responsible for, but not limited to, the following functions:

- Assist in layout and construction of voice and data distribution cabling;
- Carry out telecommunications cabling (copper and fibre optics) installations, both internal and external;
- Assist in providing backbone support via optical fibre to various sites as required;
- Provide support to communications/data connectivity;
- Carry out physical overhead wire support system for all telecommunications cabling;
- Assist in installing telecommunications closets(cabinets/racks);
- Perform terminations of telecommunications cables and main distribution points;
- Assist in supervising the implementation of projects in Infrastructure/Cabling Unit;
- Perform other related duties as required.

Competencies

Professionalism: Knowledge of telecommunication equipment, principles of operations, including local area networks, satellites, radio and video surveillance systems, voice and messaging systems. Knowledge of satellite earth station technology, and principles of analog and digital transmission. Knowledge of

synchronous and asynchronous data interface standards and protocols. Knowledge of satellite modem, CSU/DSU, and digital line driver operation. Ability to apply knowledge and technical skills to install and test relevant equipment, provide maintenance services and user support. Ability to assist with analog and digital transmission facility testing and trouble-shooting. Shows pride in work and achievements; demonstrates professional competence and mastery of subject matter; is conscientious and efficient in meeting commitments, observing deadlines and achieving results; is motivated by professional rather than personal concerns; shows persistence when faced with difficult problems or challenges; remains calm in stressful situations. Takes responsibility for incorporating gender perspectives and ensuring the equal participation of women and men in all areas of work.

Communication: Speaks and writes clearly and effectively; listens to others, correctly interprets messages from others and responds appropriately; asks questions to clarify and exhibits interest in having two-way communication; tailors language, tone, style and format to match audience; demonstrates openness in sharing information and keeping others informed.

Teamwork: Works collaboratively with colleagues to achieve organizational goals; solicits input by genuinely valuing others' ideas and expertise; is willing to learn from others; places team agenda before personal agenda; supports and acts in accordance with final group decision, even when such decisions may not entirely reflect own position; shares credit for team accomplishments and accepts joint responsibility for team shortcomings.

Technological Awareness: Keeps abreast of available technology; understands applicability and limitation of technology to the work of the office; actively seeks to apply technology to appropriate tasks; shows willingness to learn new technology.

Education

High School diploma or equivalent required. Valid driver's license required. Proof of training, i.e. certificate or diploma, in telecommunications infrastructure/cabling is an asset.

Work Experience

At least two (2) years of experience working in telecommunications infrastructure/cabling.

Languages

English and French are the working languages of the United Nations Secretariat. For this position advertised, fluency in oral and written French and English are required.

Special notice

While performing the duties of this job, the Cabling Technician is frequently required to walk and stand. The Cabling Technician will also be required to handle or operate objects, tools, or controls; and reach with hands and arms. The employee is occasionally required to climb or balance; stoop, kneel, crouch, or crawl.
